- -Most people wanted the Auction and it was decided that we would do it in the spring at the March meeting. (Right before Easter.) Linsey said she would help set up the online version. (15 were in favor, 4 were against)



- -Stacy is looking into a fundraiser, "Got Sneakers?" that involves recycling old or used tennis shoes. Sneakers in excellent shape would get \$7.00, good shape would get \$2.00 and fair shape would get \$1.00. More information at our next meeting.
- -It was proposed everyone bring a book to our December meeting. Target audience is first to fifth graders.

Lastly, we voted on the Nominating Committee. It will be Laura Downes, Cheri Flick and Sr. Jane Meyer.

After singing the Delta Kappa Gamma song, Alisha adjourned the meeting at 7:35.

Theta Lambda Chapter was chartered in April of 1968. For the first few years, chapter members had been contributing money to our own chapter scholarship fund. However, in 1972, it was recommended by the chapter scholarship committee that the money that had been collected should be turned over to the state scholarship fund so that it could be better dispersed. This recommendation was approved by chapter members. At the state convention in June of 1974, Theta Lambda received an award of Highest Honors for its gift to the State Scholarship Fund.

The international program theme for 1972-1974 was "Changing Times: Challenge or Dilemma". The chapter program of work committee presented many programs centered around this topic. At one meeting, the chapter was shown how cassette video taping could be used in the classroom as a successful approach to leaning.

Certainly over the last 50 years, there have been many changes, challenges, and dilemmas in approaches to learning.
