Back in the Day – 50 Years Ago (1973)

Chapter dues were \$13.00, but members were assessed an extra \$3.00 to cover the cost of purchasing new editions of the Delta Kappa Gamma Handbook and Constitution for the chapter.

Members furnished self-addressed stamped envelopes so the chapter newsletter could be mailed to them. Newsletters were typed on a typewriter and purple ink copies were made on school mimeograph machines.

A 25-cent penalty was imposed on members not wearing their DKG pins. Collected funds were contributed to the World Fellowship Fund.

Theta Lambda celebrated its fifth birthday at the Cohen House at Rice University where the chapter initiated its charter members five years earlier.

The Alpha State (Texas) Convention was held in June of 1973 in San Antonio.
