

Catherine mentioned a new service project for the next biennium. She brought up members pairing up to help teachers at local schools. During these trying times, she thinks we could support them. Catherine also is open for suggestions.

Our Raffle for, "Dollars for Desserts" was won by our visitor, Katie Ryan.

Our program for the evening, "Books, Books, and More Books; Oh, What is Happening to Books?" was presented by Valerie Koehler of Blue Willow Bookshop. Valerie began by giving an update on the Texas law that would have required book vendors to rate a book's sexual content before being sold to schools. The law would have been difficult for small bookstores to implement, cost them a lot of money in extra staff time, and there could be consequences if the state found the rating unsatisfactory. An appeals court ruled the law unconstitutional. The law is still working its way through the courts. Book banning by school districts and the elimination of librarians was also discussed. It was the overall consensus among those present that these were extremely incorrect decisions and the children are the ones who will suffer. Then Valerie gave us a list of 10 books she recommends and gave a synopsis of each. It was very informative. Members were given time to shop.

Catherine Hague adjourned the meeting at 6:40.


