Minutes of February 18, 2014 Theta Lambda Meeting

Members and guests gathered in the home of Carol TenBrook. The meeting was called to order at 6 p.m. by President, Laura Downes. Hostesses Jodi Knuppel and Stacy Frenchwood were thanked for the delicious meal. The inspiration was given by Sally Kubiac. She spoke about the invisible bucket theory. She read from Simple Faith in Mister Rogers and challenged us to take a minute and think who makes a difference and give a little silence to be thankful for the people who made us who we are.

Zak and Christine Perret presented a program about wellness and taught and demonstrated yoga movements that are helpful for body strengthening, reduction of anxiety and flexibility. Handouts were provided to members as a resource.

Old business was discussed from the December meeting. Minutes and treasurer's reports were accepted. Early career educator motivators were provided. It was announced that \$163.80 had been collected for the Change for Africa project. Members will continue collecting until May 2014. Toiletries and clothing items were determined to be given to Sister Jane as she participates with her students in the Living Water projects in Africa that creates self sufficiency. Member moved to send money collected for Change for Africa to the St. Agnes Africa Project. Theta Lambda has budgeted \$25 for the Delta Kappa Gamma Change for Africa Project and remaining dollars be given to the St. Agnes project.

It was reported that all reports to state and national headquarters had been mailed in before required deadlines. Stacy Frenchwood gave a legislative report and handed out information on recent state TEA waivers and changes in graduation level credits.

Venues for the Theta Lambda birthday celebration were discussed. It was decided that the event will be at Berryhills on Highway 59. We are encouraged to bring guests to the celebration. Members are encouraged to recruit new members for a May initiation.

Application deadlines were given for scholarships. The nominating committee is meeting to bring forth a list of officers. The Alpha State Convention was discussed and \$1000 is allotted for both the President and incoming president to attend. Members celebrated the nomination of former Theta Lambda member, Karen Duke, for an international honor.

It was announced that Michelle Glick will be participating in the Adobe training in San Antonio. She will be discussing research using the Reading Invention Model.

The next Theta Lambda meeting will be at Highlands Elementary in Fort Bend ISD.

The meeting adjourned at 7:35.
