How often have you had the opportunity to visit an international university, meet students from other cultures, hear speakers from several different backgrounds and ethnicities discuss global concerns, and be fed breakfast and lunch, as well? The opportunity is here, and you are being welcomed and encouraged to attend! You may also bring students, friends or potential DKG members.

The 2015 CTAUN Conference is being held in Houston on April 11, at the North American University. CTAUN (Committee on Teaching About the United Nations) was founded in 1999 to provide educators worldwide with opportunities to learn about the work of the United Nations and incorporate global awareness into curricula and school activities at all levels.

The conference starts at 9:00 AM with a continental breakfast, then proceeds with a keynote speaker, panel discussions, Fiesta International lunch, an international students' cultural fair, and breakout sessions. The day concludes at 3:15 PM with closing remarks.

Speakers for the day will be discussing topics which range from excellence and equity in education to human trafficking; education outside of Texas to immigration; cultural differences to a corporate perspective to working with different cultures; and explanations of different cultural organizations and foundations.

This is an amazing opportunity for your members who teach Social Studies courses or who just love international information. A brochure which includes all pertinent information is available to anyone who is interested in attending. The brochure and registration forms can be found on the <a href="www.dkgtexas.org">www.dkgtexas.org</a> site. The registration fee for adults is \$50.00 which includes all of the above mentioned activities. There is a \$25.00 fee for any students who would be interested in attending and this also includes all of the activities. I am also attaching the brochure, which can be opened in Publisher.
